



111TH GREY CUP MEDIA CREDENTIAL POLICY

The official Grey Cup media credential issued by the Canadian Football League provides access to the stadium for the Grey Cup game, the competing teams' practices, as well as the CFL Awards and other CFL media conferences during Grey Cup Week.

Grey Cup and Grey Cup Festival credentials are separate.

While applications for both are completed through the same Accreditation Portal, Festival credentials are solely managed and approved by the Grey Cup Festival.

WHEN APPLYING

1. Requests for accreditation must be made by Sports Editors/Directors.
2. For media outlets planning to send more than one individual, Sports Editors/Directors may apply for multiple people on a single form.
3. Applications will be evaluated on their own merits. Membership in a writers or broadcasters association does not automatically qualify an individual for credentials. Having been accredited for other major sporting events, CFL regular season, CFL playoffs games or previous Grey Cup games does not automatically qualify an individual for credentials.
4. Work samples may be requested to support applications.





POLICY

1. All pass holders must be at least 18 years of age.
2. The Canadian Football League reserves the right to revoke a media credential for any misuse.
3. Individuals must have their own media credential on their person in order to be granted access to the stadium or other CFL venues.
4. On gameday, all media members are required to remain in designated media areas with their equipment turned off until the conclusion of the game and the trophy presentations.
5. Seating in the press box is only granted to working media members. A seating chart will be determined by representatives from the CFL and the Football Reporters of Canada. Additional media spaces will be provided for auxiliary media workrooms, a post-game/practice press conference room and a photographers' workroom. Televisions will be available to broadcast the Grey Cup in these additional media spaces.
6. TSN and RDS are the only television stations permitted to broadcast the game, and the pregame and postgame ceremonies. No other cameras are permitted to shoot or record from inside the stadium or on the field on gameday.
7. Shooting or recording the game from inside the stadium is strictly prohibited without written permission from the CFL, TSN and RDS. Requests to do so must be submitted to Brian Collins, Director of Broadcast partnerships at bcollins@cfl.ca no later than 11:59:59pm ET on Sunday, November 10.
