2024-25 ANNUAL REPORT SUMMARY

FOOTBALL OPERATIONS

- The Football Club returned to the playoffs with a 9-8-1 record, winning the Western Semi-Final at home against the B.C. Lions.
- Head Coach Corey Mace, offensive lineman Logan Ferland and defensive back Rolan Milligan Jr. represented the Club and the West Division at the 2024 CFL Awards, with Milligan Jr. taking home hardware for Most Outstanding Defensive Player.
- Eight talented players were divisional All-CFL, including quarterback Trevor Harris, receiver Samuel Emilus, offensive lineman Logan Ferland, defensive tackle Micah Johnson, linebacker Jameer Thurman, cover linebacker C.J. Reavis, cornerback Marcus Sayles, and twice recognized Rolan Milligan Jr. (halfback and special teams), a league-best five of which took home league honours.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

- Buoyed by strong on-field performance including a home playoff game and strong merchandise sales, the Club recognized an EBIDA of \$4.7 million and a net operating profit of \$2.1 million.
- Overall, the Club's total revenues increased to \$40.8 million which was a 15% increase over the prior year.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- Jorgen Hus took home the Roughriders third straight Jake Gaudaur Veteran's Award, given to the Canadian player who best represents the attributes of Canadian veterans. The Roughriders are the only Club to win this award in consecutive years.
- In partnership with the Saskatchewan Roughrider Foundation \$1.8 million was given back to amateur football, through Rider Nation's support of the Foundation 50/50 presented by ISC.
- The Club unveiled a new Indigenous logo designed by Chris Chipak of the Red Pheasant Cree Nation (Treaty 6). The logo, which reflects deep cultural meaning, was proudly displayed on player helmets and throughout the stadium during our kisiskâciwan game on September 28th.
